

Princess Frederica's ABC Fund



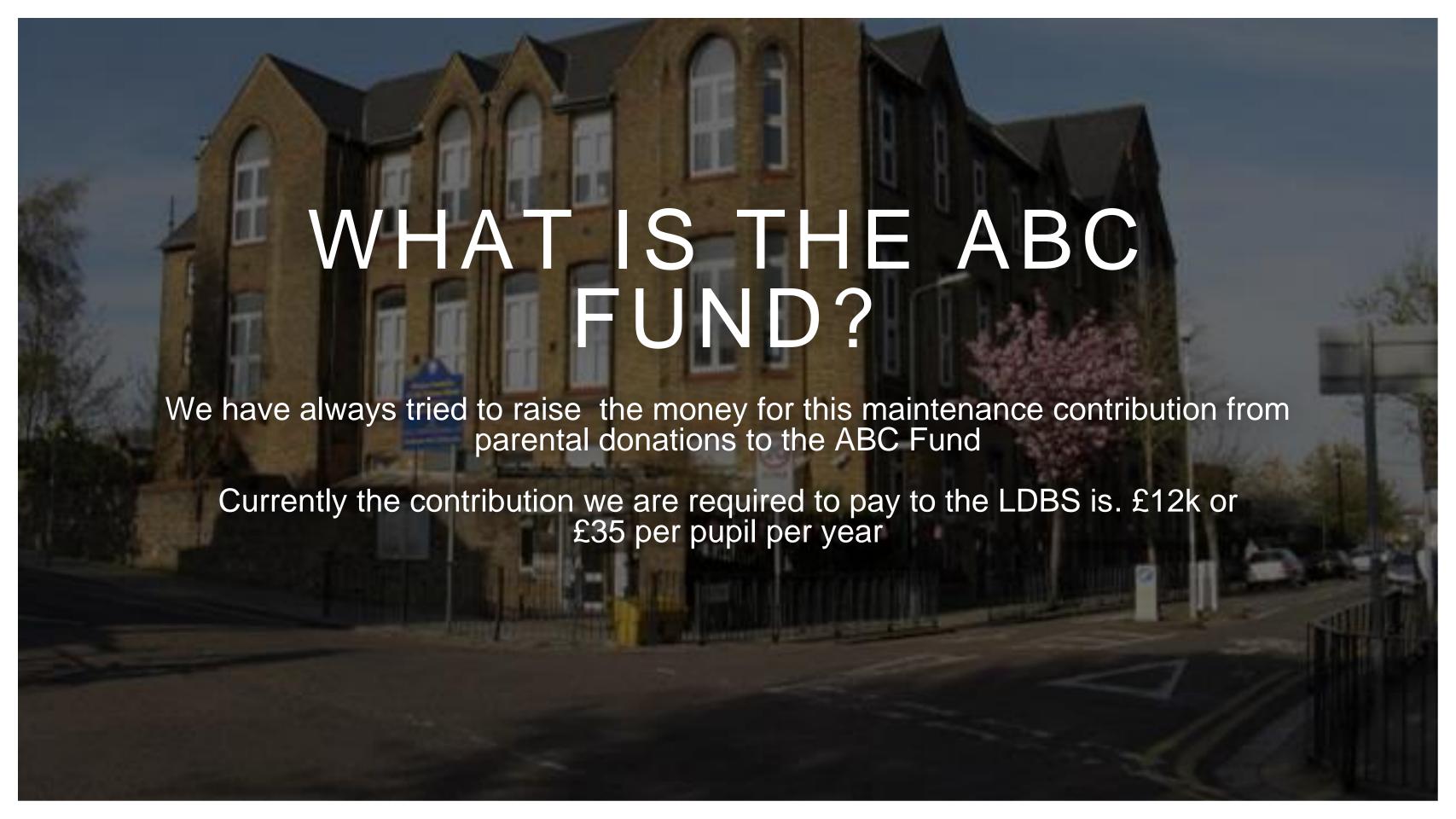
BACKGROUND

Princess Frederica, like comparable State schools such as Kenmont and Salusbury, receives all its funding from local government.

However, as a Church of England Voluntary Aided (CE VA) school we must contribute a proportion of the overall cost of school maintenance to the London Diocesan Board for Schools (LDBS), which owns the buildings.

Being a voluntary aided school means we have more independence over how we run the school, the curriculum and the extra-curricular activities that we provide.

HOW HAS THE ABC FUND BEEN USED IN THE PAST?

In 2016, we used the fund to repair the Reception and Y1 toilets (total cost of £21,000), as well as make improvements in the hall.

This year, we are accessing the LDBS fund to replace the kitchen roof (total cost of £100,000).

HOW DOES THE ABC FUND FIT IN WITH OTHER SCHOOL FUNDING?

SCHOOL CORE FUNDING

Our core funding is the main source of income for the school. It comes from the Local Education Authority and pays for:

- 1. Teaching and learning
- 2. Core maintenance and costs of running a school

ABC FUND

The ABC should enable us to go further in meeting the ambitions, values and ethos of the school and improve the educational experience of all children. It could contribute to:

- 1. Extra curricular activities such as additional music, languages and PE activity
- 2. Maintenance/upkeep beyond the core to improve the school environment

PSA

The PSA is the body of all parents, carers and staff at the school. Its aim is to enrich the experience of all children at Princess Freds. It has 2 functions:

- 1. It raises money for activities that enhance children's wellbeing such as the annual Art Week & Book Week and the Embankment project.
- 2. It also works to enhance parental and community engagement in the school



THE PROBLEM IS TWO-FOLD: FIRST, WE NEED TO MEET OUR MAINTENANCE TARGET

In 2015, we raised £5,500 of the £12,000 required In 2016, we have raised £5,400 of the £12,000 required

The deficit from each of these years has to come from the budget we allocate towards staff and the education of the pupils. With 85% of the school's total budget going towards staff costs, this is a huge strain at a time when LEA funding is falling.

We don't want to compromise the value-add non curriculum options we already offer from our valued staff team. Nor do we want to compromise on the maintenance we need to do, but these will be in jeopardy if we don't make changes and provide more support.

SECOND: WE NEED TO COMBAT BROADER SCHOOLS CUTS

School budgets nationwide are being squeezed by Government funding cuts and there are currently proposals from government to reduce this further.

This is exacerbated by overheads including employers' pension, national insurance contributions and teachers' pay increasing.

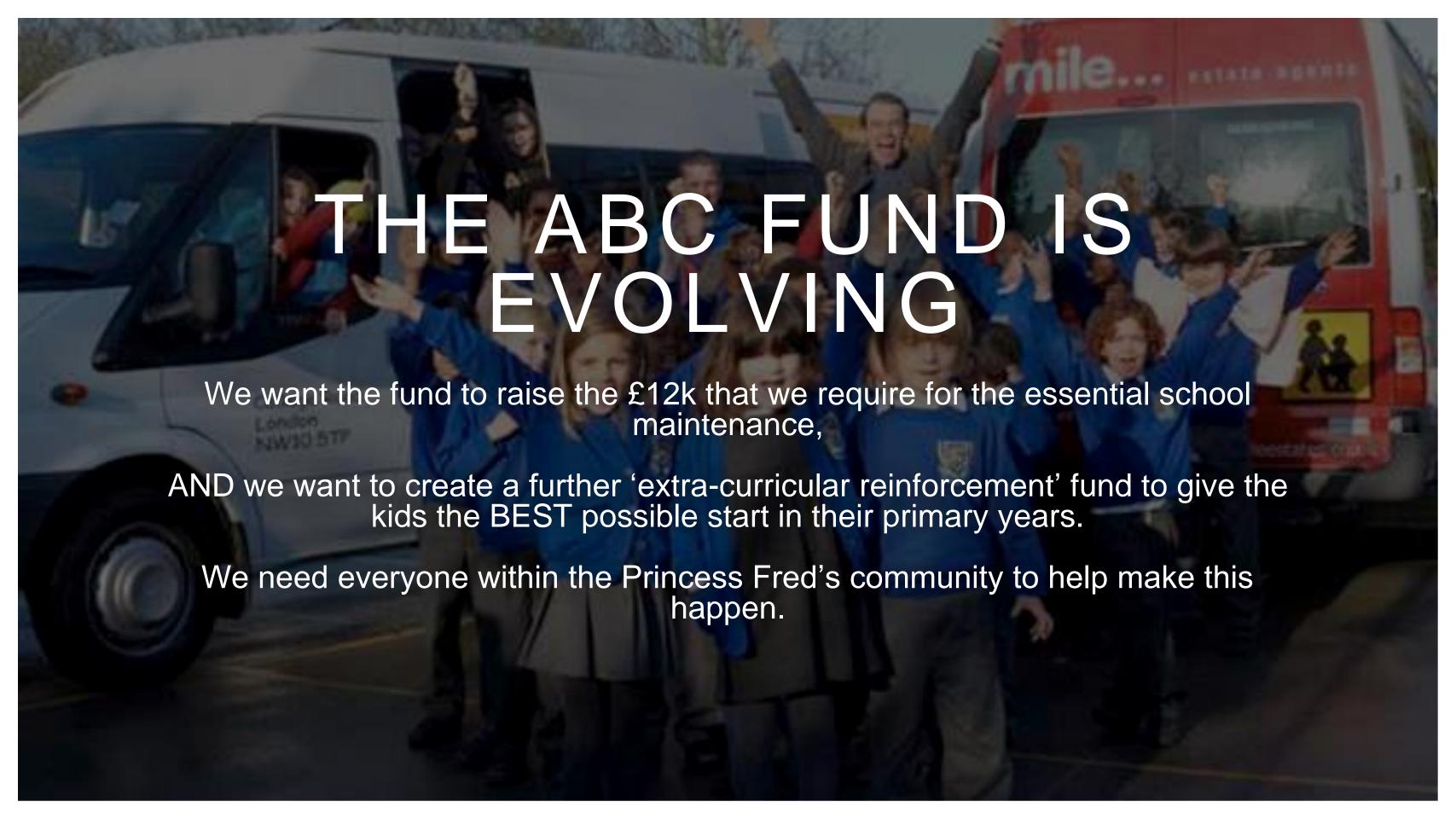
The Institute for Fiscal Studies has predicted that schools face funding cuts of 8% by 2020 once inflation is taken into account.

Princess Frederica has already taken substantial steps to find operational efficiencies without compromising the high standard of education we provide.

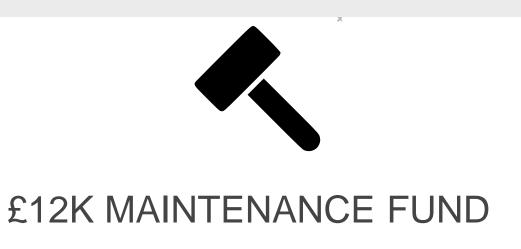
