Things to know

What instruments the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings have played?

- The first instruments were made from bone or wood wind instruments. The ones which have been found are all end-blown.
- Another woodwind instrument is a set of panpipes made from a small slab of wood which date from the 10th century.
- Another type of wind instrument was a recorder made from a cow-horn. A four-hole cow-horn recorder was found at Västerby in Sweden.
