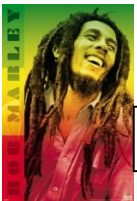

Scientist

A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences.

Boxer

The study of the principles and use of computers.

A music genre that originated in Jamaica in the late 1960s
