

Ready Steady Grow - Reception - Summer Term 1st Half 2023

Why are we	learning	this	now?
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This half term in Reception we will be learning all about growing. We will observe frog spawn and see the life cycle of a frog in action. We will also plant our own broad beans and bulbs, learn how to take care of them and watch as they develop and grow. In maths, we will continue to deepen our understanding of numbers to 10 and explore numbers to 20 and beyond. We will also be exploring numerical patterns, including odd and even numbers and doubles.

By the end of the Learning Journey, what skills, knowledge and experiences will the children have had?

Knowledge - The children will learn about the life cycles of plants and animals and will know the correct vocabulary to talk about this. They will learn number facts including odds, evens and doubles and will also know how to count to 20 and beyond. In phonics, they will learn how communities to segment and blend CVC, CCVC, CVCC, CCVCC, CCCVC and CCCVCC words to read, spell and write words and sentences.

Skills – The children will be working on their fine motor skills to help them develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient. They will also work on their aiming and throwing skills in PE and continue to develop their core strength and coordination. They will continue to take part in guided reading sessions and will be practising decoding words





Literacy - Reading	To recognise high frequency words and tricky words To continue developing reading strategies: directionality of print, picture clues, matching words, initial and final sounds. To take part in group guided reading sessions - show awareness of the listener when reading aloud such as expression, responding to punctuation and developing comprehension skills. To explore fiction/non-fiction texts.
Literacy - Writing	To write sentences using a capital letter, full stop and finger spaces. To write instructions for planting a bean. To record observations in a bean diary.
