Good morning,



We will list the items here that you will need for the live sessions:


Phonics - You will need paper and a pencil for writing words and sentences today.


Writing Task:

This week we are reading Hansel and Gretel. We have shared a version of the story on Google Classrooms in case you would like to read it again.




Task 3




