

Good Morning Reception Paris and Reception France,





Read it with your parent or carer, or listen to it being read here – https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eHoGdGokXfc</p> <p>Write your own story based on <i>Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?</i> in your red book. Take a look at the example below to get started (remember to replace ‘Mr Richards’ with your own name!)</p> <p><i>Mr Richards, Mr Richards, what do you hear? I hear Mr Abreu tapping his hammer. Mr Abreu, Mr Abreu, what do you hear...?</i></p>	<p><u>Pouring Drinks</u></p> <p>Parents and carers, discuss with your child the terms <i>full</i> and <i>empty</i>, using cups of water as a visual aid.</p> <p>Encourage your child to demonstrate their understanding by asking them to pour drinks for other family members. Can they make one cup nearly full? Can they pour a half cup for somebody? Can they point to an empty cup and explain how they know that it is empty?</p>	<p><u>Musical Bumps</u></p> <p>Play a game of Musical Bumps! Put on some of your favourite music and dance around your living room. When the music stops, sit down as fast as you can. The last one standing is out!</p> <p><u>Hide and Seek</u></p> <p>Play Hide and Seek with a family member (or ask your parent to hide some toys for you to find). How quickly can you find them all? Make sure you move quickly to try to beat the clock!</p>

Some may be silly questions!</p>	<p><u>Letter Formation</u> Practise writing your digraphs, let's start with qu, ch, th, sh, ng,</p>	<p><u>Fill Up Jugs</u> Parents and carers, collect a variety of cups, jugs and beakers and set up some challenges for your child to explore.</p> <p><i>How many cups will fill up this jug? Which of these containers holds the most sand? How many spoonfuls of sand fill this cup?</i></p>	<p><u>Animal Kingdom</u> Can you act like different animals? Hop like a frog, walk like a penguin, balance like a flamingo, crawl like a bear, slither like a snake and bounce like a kangaroo. Imitating the movements of different animals will develop your physical strength and you might even learn something about the animals you imitate!</p>
