The job of a nurse




A nurse's job requires treating patients who are sick and injured and offering advice and emotional support to patients and their families, taking care of paperwork and helping doctors diagnose patients and providing advice and follow-up care.

<u>Facts</u>

- Mary Seacole was a nurse. She was born in Jamaica in 1805. She treated soldiers in the Crimean war.
- Florence Nightingale was a British nurse born in 1820. She was a nurse during the Crimean war and changed the way hospitals were run.
- Edith Cavell was a nurse born in 1865. She saved soldiers from both sides during WWI.
- The NHS was launched on 5th July 1948. NHS stands for National Health Service
