



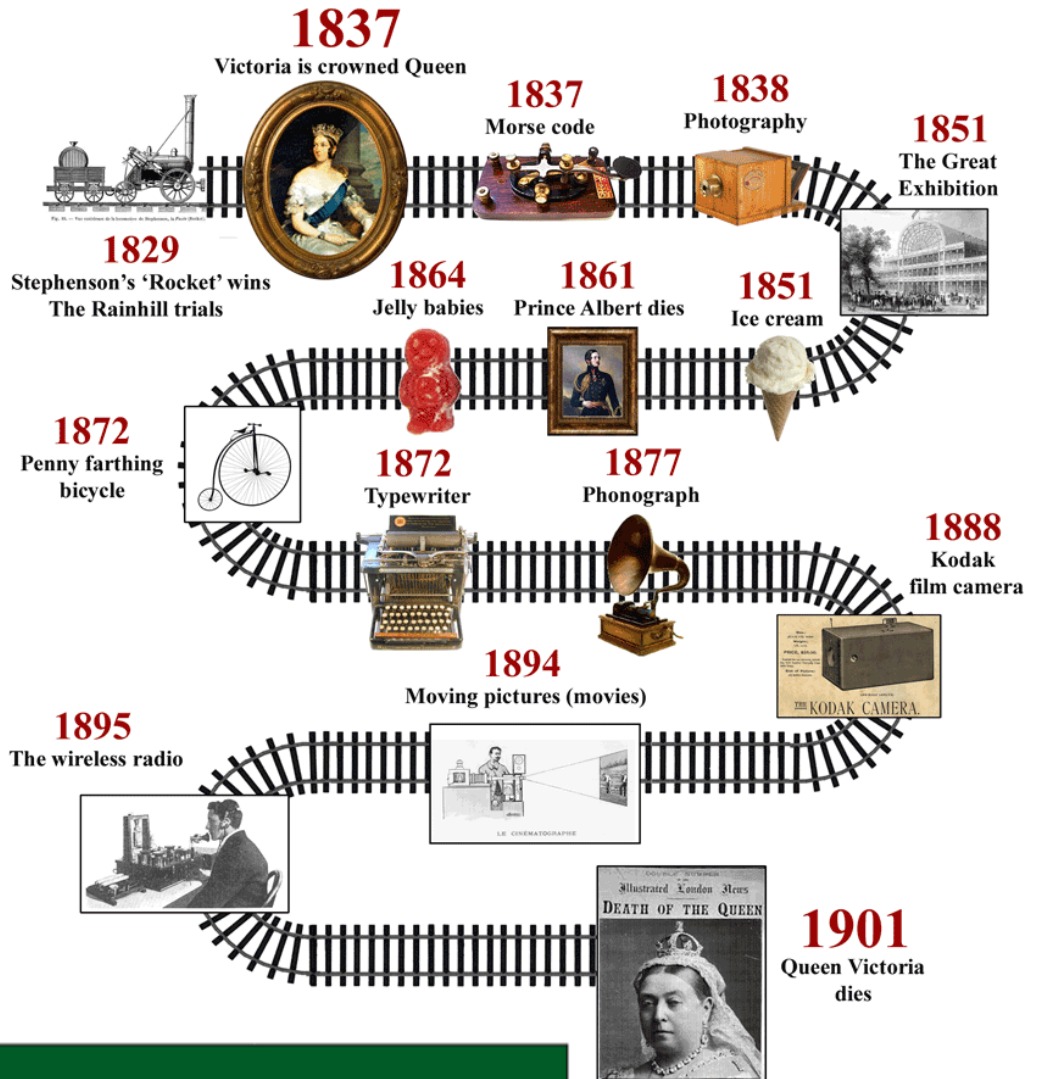
Knowledge Organiser: The Victorians

Assessment Question: What was the most significant change in the Victorian era?

Key Vocabulary:

the Victorian era	a period in British history named after Queen Victoria. The Victorian era was 1837 – 1901.
empire	a group of countries ruled over by a single monarch, such as Queen Victoria.
civilisation	people living in a large well-organised group, with laws, order and culture.
Industrial revolution	a period of major changes in the way products were made (manufactured) and transported. Fewer things were made by hand and instead machines in larger-scale factories used steam and water power to mass-produce products.
reign	the period of rule of monarch.
architecture	the complex or carefully designed structure of something, usually a building.
century	a period of one hundred years.

Key facts: The 19th century was one of **rapid development and change**. During this period England changed from a **rural, agricultural** country to an **urban, industrialised** one and **population** more than doubled. This radically altered the nature of society, taking many years for both **government** and people to adjust to the new conditions. Some of the changes included jobs, architecture, rights, everyday items and school.
