


Knowledge Organiser: The Victorians

	were made (manufactured) and transported.			
	Fewer things were made by hand and instead			
	machines in larger-scale factories used steam and			
	water power to mass-produce products.			
reign	the period of rule of monarch.			
architecture	the complex or carefully designed structure of			
	something, usually a building.			
century	a period of one hundred years.			

Key facts: The 19th century was one of rapid development and change. During this period England changed from a rural, agricultural country to an urban, industrialised one and population more than doubled. This radically altered the nature of society, taking many years for both government and people to adjust to the new conditions. Some of the changes included jobs, architecture, rights, everyday items and school.
