

ordnance survey map	up to date and accurate maps showing the landscape's human and physical features using the same symbols, which are included in a key.
relief	the difference between its highest and lowest elevations
contour	lines drawn on a map that show a change in elevation
trade	the exchange of goods and services between one country and another
economy	system by which goods and services are produced, sold, and bought in a country or region
industry	a group of businesses that make or sell similar products or perform similar services
tourism	Tourism is the business of encouraging and supporting when people travel for pleasure
grid reference	a location on a map, which is found using the northing and easting numbered lines.
