Physical & Human Geography of France

- It consists of a terrain that is mostly flat land with mountains in the south (including the Massif Central and the Pyrenees) and the east (the highest points being in the Alps).
- France has generally warm summer and cool winters. The temperature is warmer in the south, with hot summers along the Mediterranean.
- France has a long and rich history, and a culture which has developed over hundreds of years. It is a tourism hotspot – millions visit Paris and other areas of France every year.

France

- France is a country in Western
 Europe and its capital is called
 Paris.
- About 67 million people live in France.
- It is the 3rd largest European country. It is bordered by Italy,
- Germany, Belgium, Spain, Monaco, Andorra, Luxembourg and Switzerland.



Comparison to the United Kingdom

- Both countries are in Europe and their capital cities (London and Paris) are similar in size.
- Due to its slightly more southerly position (closer to the Equator) France is generally a little warmer than the UK.
- -France is larger than the UK (551,695 sq. km compared to 243,610sq km.) meaning slightly more people live in France than the UK – 67 million people compared to 66 million people.
