The location of the Mangrove Cafe which was run by activist Frank Crichlow. It was raided 12 times between 1969 and 1970. Many people protesting the raids were then arrested including what became known as the 'Mangrove Nine'. The trial was significant because it was the first judicial acknowledgement of racial prejudice in the Police.
