

The Creation Story

Key Vocabulary:

Rules and laws: guidelines for how people should behave. They are based on ideas about what is right and wrong.

Creed: Derived from the Latin 'credo', meaning 'I believe', statement of belief.

Responsibility: Something you are expected to do. It might be a task or it might be a way you are expected to act.

Commitment: Pledging or binding yourself to a certain course of action, or to a person no matter what the case may be.

Consequence: The result of a person's actions

Secular Creed: Beliefs or statements that are not centred around God but rather on social issues such as diversity, equality etc

Ten Commandments: A set of beneficial laws given by God to Moses on Mount Sinai. These rules underpin Christian living.

Creation: The belief that the universe and the various forms of life were created by God out of nothing

Key facts:

Every religion has a creed, which is a statement of the basic beliefs of a religious faith or a set of guiding rules or beliefs. All three creeds -Islam, Judaism and Christianity - are very clear that there is only one God

The Apostles' Creed and the Nicene creed are the only ones that refer to the Trinity concept of God. they include a brief outline of Jesus' life (God born as man)

The Shahadah is the only creed that says Muhammad is a messenger of God. It also includes a blessing after the name Muhammad.

In the Shema, God is never spelt fully. The vowel sounds are replaced with punctuation (G-D). This is because Jews consider the name of God to be so Holy that it can never be destroyed. This creates a problem as paper does not last forever: to help solve this problem they thought of writing it another way.
