

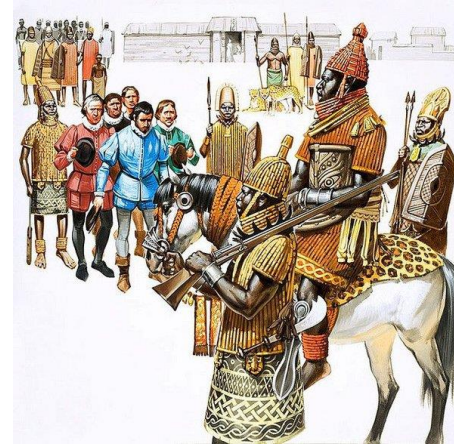
The kingdom of Benin (also known as the Edo Kingdom) was a civilisation that was located in West Africa in the area now known as Nigeria.

The Edo people did not write down their history but passed it on through oral tradition.



The reason that the Kingdom of Benin was so prosperous was largely due to its skilled craftsmen and the subsequent trading of goods to the rest of Africa and then Europe.



Benin Bronzes

The Edo people wanted to make things of value, and so they established specialist guilds where people could learn a craft to a very high level of skill. Craftworkers used lots of different materials including iron, bronze, wood and ivory to make pots, tools, weapons and artworks.

Oba	A chief or ruler in Benin / Nigeria
artefact	an object made by a human being who lived in the past
traders	People who buy and sell goods or currency
conquer	To defeat an enemy, or to take control of the land in another country
kingdom	A country or territory ruled by a king or queen
Empire	A large group of countries ruled over by one rule
prosperous	Rich and successful
guilds	A group of people who do the same job
civilisation	a complex human society, usually made up of different cities, with certain characteristics of cultural and technological development
