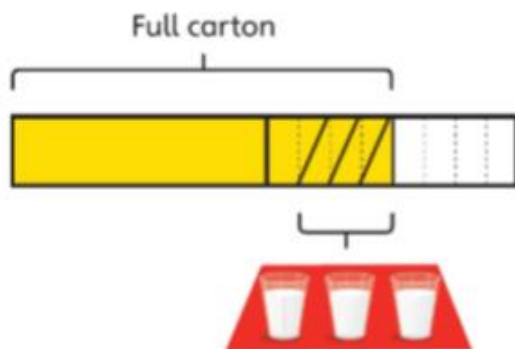
Maths Day 4



- 1 a) Jen pours 3 glasses of milk from the $1\frac{1}{2}$ litre carton.
Each glass holds $\frac{1}{8}$ of a litre.
How much milk is left in the carton?
- b) The large carton holds $2\frac{3}{4}$ litres more than the small carton.
How much milk do the two cartons hold in total?

Share

- a) The carton holds $1\frac{1}{2}$ litres. Each glass holds $\frac{1}{8}$ litre.

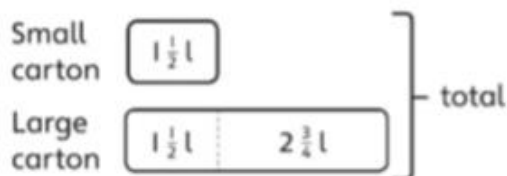


I converted $1\frac{1}{2}$ to $1\frac{4}{8}$ to make it easier to subtract $\frac{3}{8}$.



$1\frac{4}{8} - \frac{3}{8} = 1\frac{1}{8}$. There is $1\frac{1}{8}$ litres of milk left in the carton.

- b)



I worked out how much was in the large carton first and then added this on to the small carton.



Large carton

$$1\frac{1}{2} + 2\frac{3}{4} = 1\frac{2}{4} + 2\frac{3}{4}$$

Add the wholes: $1 + 2 = 3$

$$\text{Add the parts: } \frac{2}{4} + \frac{3}{4} = \frac{5}{4} = 1\frac{1}{4}$$

$$\text{Add wholes and parts: } 3 + 1\frac{1}{4} = 4\frac{1}{4}$$

The large carton holds $4\frac{1}{4}$ litres.

Total

$$1\frac{1}{2} + 4\frac{1}{4} = 1\frac{2}{4} + 4\frac{1}{4}$$

$$1 + 4 = 5$$

$$\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{4} = \frac{3}{4}$$

$$5 + \frac{3}{4} = 5\frac{3}{4}$$

There are $5\frac{3}{4}$ litres of milk in total.
