e.g. The basic principle was that those who worked hard would be rewarded.

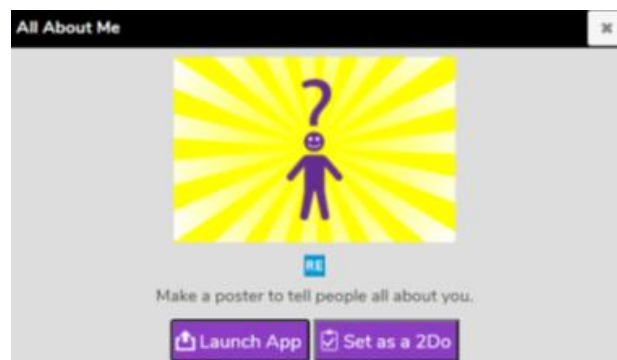
