Here is a little guidance for some of the questions:

Writing

There has been a huge natural disaster or weather event. Your job is to write a newspaper article reporting the story. It is up to you what happened: could be a volcano, or massive thunder and lightening storm, or hurricane etc. You can set the story anywhere you choose: in London, rural Indonesia, African plains, wherever you choose. Decide on whether you wish to write an informal tabloid story or a more formal broadsheet story

Tips for success:

- include a headline
- lead paragraph containing 5 'w's
- chronological retelling of events
- quotes – reported and direct
- what will happen next?
- write in the appropriate register for what you have decided
