Aims and Expectations

Aims:

- Give parents a clear idea on the SATs process and the results.
- Give parents an opportunity to understand how the next few months will look

To note:

- Balance with other subjects and focus weeks doesn't change. School committed to providing a balanced curriculum.
- Asking for no more than their best and fulfilling their potential.
- Preparation for tests and being secondary school ready.

A Typical day during SATs

-If your child is unwell or something happens that might impact them during these tests, please let the school know ASAP so arrangements can be made.

- Keep routines similar to a normal day (breakfast)
- Children start the day in exactly the same way at the normal time.
- Children will register together as normal but tables will be separated and room will have all displays covered.
- No equipment will be on tables.
- Some children may work in other rooms with a dedicated adult. This might be 1:1 or as a small group. These children leave at this point.
- Staff member leading will hand out resources and the test paper.
- Head of School will distribute sealed papers and these will be opened just before test.
- Children will have instructions read to them and opportunity to ask any questions.
- Time of test starting will be written on the board and a count down timer will also operate.
- Children expected to **use all time available to them**. Nothing on tables for them that may distract.
- Children will be told when half-way through the test and when 5 minutes remain.
- When time up, tests are collected in.
- Children then relax, have a snack and take an extended break.
- Process repeated at approximately 10:30 where there is a second test in the day.

Converting marks (raw score) to a scaled score

Children and parents will receive a scaled score for reading, maths and grammar. The scaled score (between 80 and 120) remains the same every year. 100 and above is always the expected standard and 110 and above is always greater depth.

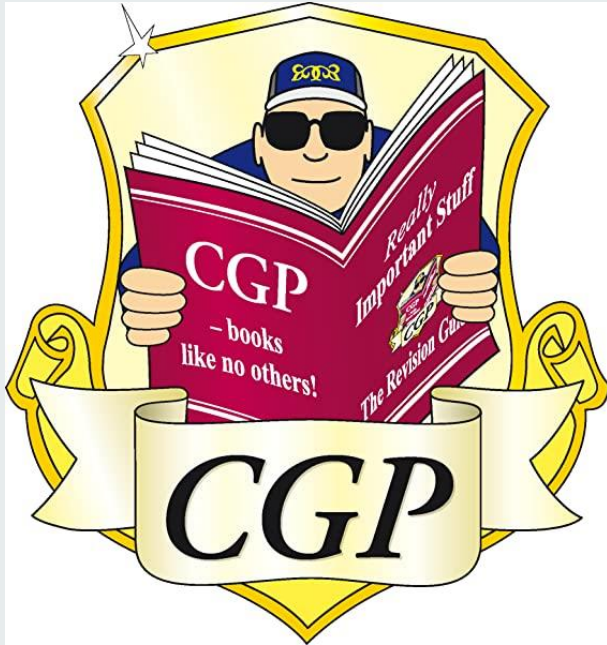
Converting marks (raw score) to a scaled score

Children and parents will receive a scaled score for reading, maths and grammar. The scaled score remains the same every year. 100 and above is always the expected standard and 110 and above is always greater depth.

Preparation for SATs including in-school support and ways to help at home.

- Daily teaching.
- 1:1 and group support
- Mock SATS tests (please do not do these with your child. We will be using these in class)
- Training in answering style of questions.
- Time management training including size of answers compared to time needed/used (versus marks available).
- CPG guides (support & marking)



- These will form an integral part of revision for your child.
- Weekly homework set 4 times a week in either reading or maths.
- Levelled books that are suitable for your child's current needs.
- Spelling Shed will continue but no Mathletics

- All children to be given a homework journal to fill in daily.
- Children will be **responsible** for filling their homework in every morning.
- Expectation of teacher to have homework ready on the board for your child to copy in daily. **Homework diaries must be in bags every day but not guides.**
- After completion of pages an adult **must sign the pages off and mark the work with the child.** **Red pens will be provided.**

CGP books

- **These books must be in on a Monday** to be checked by an adult. We will be checking that these have been signed off by an adult at home and the pages have been completed and marked.
- Failure to do so will result in **lunch time detentions.**
- The reasons for upping the responsibility:
 - a) to prepare your child for secondary school
 - b) to help them understand the importance of being responsible for own learning and revision
 - c) to get them into the mindset of working hard for their assessments

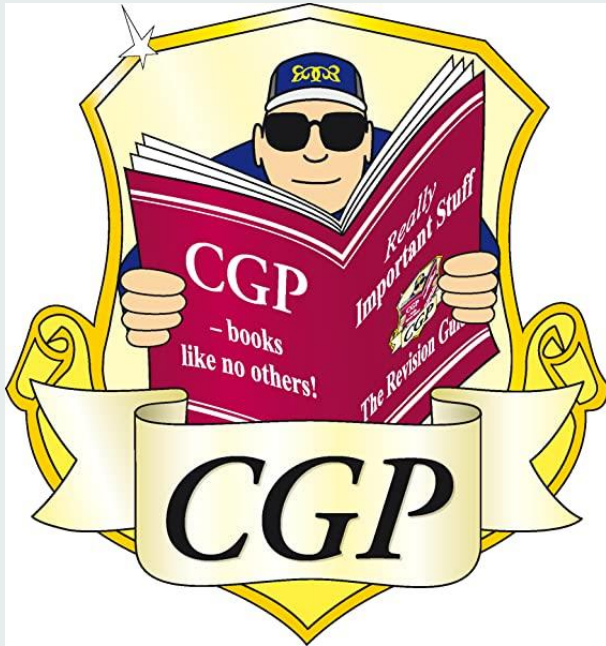
CGP books

- It a decision for you and your child as to how and when your child does the work set.
- Our recommendation is daily bursts of the work set rather than leaving everything to the weekend.
- We do understand there are days when your child has other responsibilities however as previously mentioned we are starting to get the children [prepared for secondary school](#).



- Expectation from an adult at home:
 - to support your child if they need help using the revision guide in maths
 - to support marking of the homework in red pen
 - to let the teacher know of any difficulties or challenges
 - to sign off the completed pages

CGP books



School Gateway is open for payment of **£11** for the books. This is a discounted price compared to if you bought these in the shop.

Your child will receive:

- Maths question book (stretch or standard)
the questions we will ask the children for homework
- Maths revision guide (stretch or standard)
a teaching manual of the year 6 maths curriculum to support you and your child
- Reading (foundation or stretch)
this is 3 booklets of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts and questions

**Books will hopefully be ready in the first week back after half term.
Your child will not receive the books until payment has been made.**
