When an adult reads to you, can you spot all the letters we have learnt so far independently (S, A, T, P, I, N, M and D)?

The book of the week is "Oh The Places You'll Go!" by Dr Seuss.




Play I Spy together. Are you able to think of words independently? When it is somebody else's turn, can you think of words that have the same initial sound?
